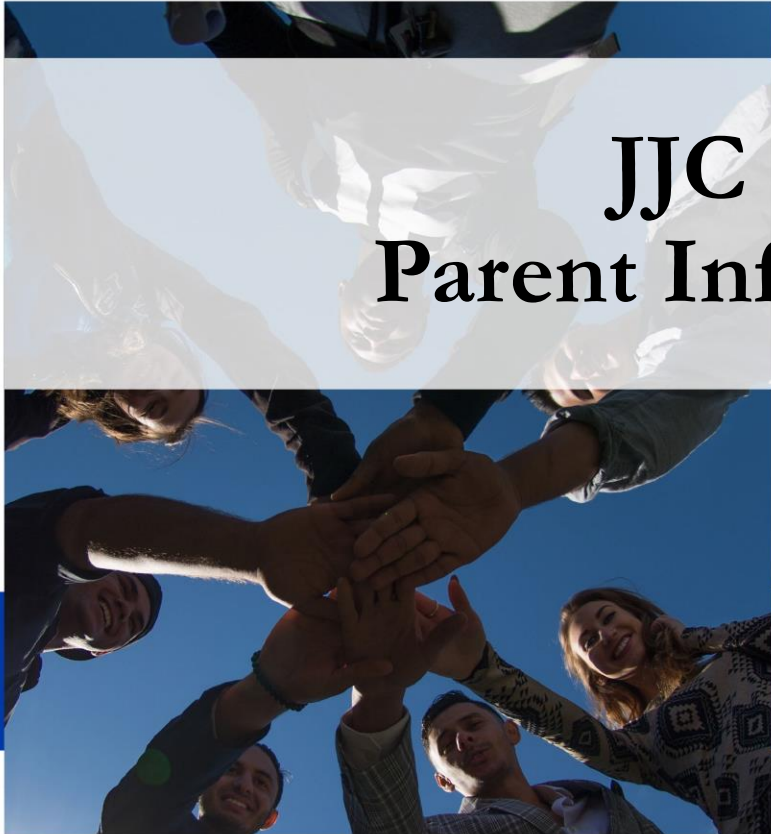

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# What Is Dual Credit?

- The Dual Credit program is a partnership between JJC and area high school and career centers. Junior and senior high school students earn both high school and college credit upon successful completion of Dual Credit courses.
- Dual Credit students begin their official college transcript with JJC. College credit is awarded immediately upon successful completion of each Dual Credit course. Students earn the same grade for both the high school course and the JJC course. Dual Credit grades will be part of the student's records throughout their college career.



# Dual Credit Accreditation

JJC is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission. The HLC establishes guidelines to ensure academic integrity of Dual Credit programs at accredited institutions.

# Benefits of Dual Credit

- **Earn College Credit Prior to High School Graduation**

Dual Credit courses are **transferable** and speed up the time to college degree completion.

- **Reduces Overall College Costs**

JJC Dual Credit courses are offered to high school students at a reduced rate \$50 per course, which is much more **affordable** than the cost of a college class offered at a traditional four-year university.

- **Student Access**

Dual Credit students are considered JJC students, and therefore are granted access to JJC **resources and activities** on campus. Campus resources include free tutoring, major and career planning, and use of the JJC Library.



# Benefits of Dual Credit

- **Convenience**

High School student can take courses as **part of the regular** school day.

- **Facilitates the Transition Between High School and College**

Dual Credit courses help prepare students for the transition to college by engaging students in college-level work and **developing pathways** to degree attainment.

- **Enhances the Curriculum for High School Students**

The addition of college coursework to high school curriculum **expands the options available** to high school students while adding college-level rigor.

# Student Responsibilities

- **Academic Honor Code**

Students are expected to demonstrate integrity, honesty, and responsibility in completing their college level coursework.

- **Transferring**

Accepting courses for transfer depends on the individual college or university. Students should contact their intended transfer institution directly to inquire about the transferability of their Dual Credit coursework.



# Student Responsibilities

- **Withdrawals**

If a student is not earning a “C” or better by midterm, it is time to consider a withdrawal. Failure to withdraw by the deadline may result in a failing grade on the student’s academic transcript.

- **Moving/Graduating Early**

If a student moves or graduates early, the student must withdraw from the Dual Credit course. Failure to withdraw from the JJC course may result in a failing grade on the JJC transcript.

- **If attending Joliet Junior College**

- Students will need their JJC ID number on exam day.
- Student will need their JJC email address if taking the ALEKS exam.

# Accuplacer and ALEKS

## Accuplacer

- Accuplacer Exam, produced by College Board, is a computer-based, untimed test for reading and writing.
- Preparation materials for the Accuplacer exam can be found at <https://accuplacer.collegeboard.org/student/practice>.

## ALEKS

- ALEKS Math placement uses open-response questioning—not multiple choice.
- Students may take ALEKS up to five times.
- ALEKS offers remediation modules students may access from home if they do not meet the required placement score.
- ALEKS remediation is a great way to boost SAT scores.



# Dual Credit Fee

- Students who attend JJC within fifteen months of high school graduation will receive a \$50 tuition credit for each dual credit course for which they paid the \$50 fee.
- Students who are eligible for free and reduced lunch do not have to pay the \$50 fee to enroll in dual credit courses, and as a result, are not eligible for the tuition credit if they matriculate to JJC.

## Joliet Junior College Office of Dual Credit Enrollment Fee Form

Joliet Junior College partners with area high schools to provide college credit for general education and career & technical courses. Dual Credit courses are held on high school campuses and are taught by high school instructors who have met community college hiring qualifications. Dual Credit classes save time, save money, provide access to JJC resources and ease the transition from high school to college.

The enrollment fee for a dual credit general education course is \$50.00\*. This fee will be waived for any student who is eligible for the free & reduced lunch program. There are no fees for career & technical courses.
